From your Pastor:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

When the calendar turns to February, it seems like the world around us begins to think almost exclusively about Valentine's Day. It comes smack dab in the middle of the month on the 14th, and even though St. Valentine was a monk who never married and a martyr who was executed after a long imprisonment, the day has become dedicated to celebrating romantic love. There are cards in stores, gifts and candies in heart shapes and many items with hearts printed on them to celebrate the connection of two people in love.

But love comes in other forms worth celebrating also. We are given the gift of love from God which binds our whole congregation together in sharing concern for each other. We share God's love together in worship, but even more importantly, we share God's love with phone calls and social calls where we get together and care for one another. Keep doing that. Encourage people to join you in doing that. Invite people to feel the love that we share at Pilgrim Lutheran Church because that is exactly what the book of Hebrews instructs us to do. "Let mutual love continue. ² Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it. ³ Remember those who are in prison, as though you were in prison with them; those who are being tortured, as though you yourselves were being tortured. ⁴ Let marriage be held in honor by all, and let the marriage bed be kept undefiled; for God will judge fornicators and adulterers. ⁵ Keep your lives free from the love of money, and be content with what you have; for he has said, 'I will never leave you or forsake you.' ⁶ So we can say with confidence, 'The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. What can anyone do to me?'" (Hebrews 13:1-6)

Sharing love is something we are called to do throughout our Christian life, but so often the world does not appreciate what we have. That doesn't mean we stop doing it! Jesus commanded us to love one another, and the more people we invite to share in that love, the better this world will be. Remember the old song, "They will Know We are Christians by our Love"? Let's make sure the world knows who we are. "Let mutual love continue."
