Synod Thank You!

We are so grateful for the prayers and support that our Eastern WA/Idaho Synod has given Pilgrim Lutheran since Pastor Don's medical incident. Bishop Kristen Kuempel came to lead the Sunday Service the very first Sunday and has arranged pulpit supply for the next month and a half. Pastor Phyllis Stromme was here to lead our service and help us with the Annual meeting on Jan 28, and with the corresponding paperwork. Pastor Matthew Kuempel will be here on Feb 4, and will continue Pastor Don's practice of doing a healing service on the first Sunday of the month. Please come to support these pastors as they hold us up, and as they continue to pray for Pastor Don's recovery and for us all. Together, we are ALL the Body of Christ.

Congregational Meeting Results
Our Annual Congregational Meeting was held Sunday, January 28, 2018. We transitioned directly to the meeting following worship led by Pastor Phyllis Stromme

There were 31 members signed in attendance.

- We voted unanimously to extend an open call to Pastor Don Short.
- We voted to adopt the 2018 Mission Budget of \$126,780.
- Ernie Summers, Tammy Rodriguez, and Pete Rodriguez were voted to positions on the Church Council.
- We decided to hold off on who would attend the Synod Assembly, pending Pastor Short's return to the congregation.
- We elected Larry McCourtie, Joe Guzman, and Pete Rodriguez to the Nominating Committee
- We re-allocated funds marked "Reserve" to "Revelations" allowing us to purchase a donation tracking software & possible computer when our current software no long functions. (It is currently obsolete but functioning well) (voting 28-1)
- We re-allocated funds marked "Youth" to "Copy Machine." (voting 28-1)
- We voted to move \$10,000 from savings to the Carpet Fund. (voting 27-2)
- We voted to have the Council look at what we have traditionally given in Benevolences to the Synod, and to return to the congregation within 6 months with a suggestion for how to increase that amount.
- We reviewed and approved the minutes from the 2017 Annual Meeting.

If you have not yet spent some time looking at the Annual Report, please do so. It includes committee reports from Fellowship, Evangelism, Property & Management, Christian Education, and Worship & Music. These reports give us a snapshot of all the activities our congregation has been involved with and as a whole, it is pretty neat!
