#### From Our Pastor:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In 1970 the Beatles released the song, "The Long and Winding Road". It talks about the struggle of someone to let go of a relationship that has ended. My relationships are fine, but I have been working through a different kind of struggle. I am full of gratitude for the many continued prayers on my behalf. I am grateful for the patience you have shown through my recovery from my medical incident. I am grateful for the pastors that have given of their time to lead worship for you in my absence. Those are all good things.

However, I am struggling with the limits of what I am capable of doing. I still tire more easily than I did in December. I still cannot walk long distances without a cane and I thank God every day for the 'delete' key on my computer because my hand-eye coordination is not what it used to be yet and I make a lot of typographical errors. I hang on tight to the words of my rehab doctor who said I should make a full recovery, but I am not fully recovered. In the meantime, I am working my way back into everyday activities slowly, and I am grateful for your patience.

My struggles, however, are nothing compared to what Jesus went through in Jerusalem. Betrayed by his own disciple, conspired against by the local religious authorities, deserted by those who promised to be faithful to him, and finally killed in the most humiliating way known at the time; death by crucifixion. None of us are called to do what Jesus did for us, but we are called to take up our cross and follow him. We are called, as Paul said to the Galatians, to "Bear one another's burdens and so fulfill the law of Christ." (Galatians 6:2) I think that is one of the strengths of this congregation; that you care well for each other. I am grateful for that caring.

My long and winding road has been the ups and downs of recovery, learning to walk with a cane and learning to be patient with myself. It is a much easier road than the Via Dolorosa, the road that led Jesus to Golgotha, where he carried his cross and then suffered and died to take away our sin. As you continue to ponder the way of the cross through our Lenten journey I encourage you to take time to consider the depth of love that God showed to us, and just how incredible it is that, "God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16) See you in church.
