Congregational Meeting Update

After the service June 10, a short congregational meeting was held. Action taken included:

- The Church Council suggested an additional \$1200 be added to our Synod Benevolences this year, bringing our quarterly donation to \$1500 and the year to \$6000. Members voted to approve this suggestion.
- The decision was made to carpet the fellowship hall, narthex, sanctuary, cry room, & offices. The carpet is compatible with our pews so they will not need replacing at this time. The carpeted walls in the fellowship hall will be redone, and the mop boards in the hall and sanctuary will be left alone to preserve the integrity of the walls and woodwork.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

I really like the flower pots on Main Street.
