School Kits Needed

We are now seeing signs advertising "Back to School" sales on supplies needed for kids to start school. School kits are sent around the world benefitting children in 1) orphanages, 2) areas where families can barely afford the fees necessary to send their children to school much less purchase supplies, and 3) refugee camps. Items needed for one school kit include:

Four 70-sheet 8-1/2 x 10-1/2 inch notebooks (this size is important) wide or college ruled.
One pencil sharpener

One blunt scissors (safety scissors for children with embedded steel blades)

Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers

Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink)

One 2-1/2 inch eraser

One box of 16 or 24 crayons (Crayola brand is best)

One 30-centimeter ruler or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other.

From your Pastor:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The new carpet is installed and looks wonderful! Throughout the building we can enjoy the new look of the place, even if we have to put up with that new carpet smell for a while. The color of the carpet seems to have made a big difference in the chapel and the fellowship hall. A few classrooms did not get re-carpeted, and the meditation room remains untouched, but the carpet is still in great shape in those rooms, almost as if God is saving them for a special purpose. How will we know God's purpose for those rooms? Well, we can pray about it and find out.

Some people are unsure about the power of prayer. Some people think prayer is a worthless response to complex problems. There is some validity to those thoughts because, so far this year after every mass shooting incident, representatives of the White House say, "Our thoughts and prayers are with the families of the victims" and yet nothing changes. Policies toward mental health and firearms remain the same. So what good is prayer if it doesn't change things? Perhaps it is important to consider how change is perceived.

I firmly believe in the power of prayer. I know God is at work in us and through us, and God has been at work all along, throughout history. Isaiah 43:19 is God's response to the prayers of the Israelites in exile. It took 70 years for God to restore the nation to its proper land, but God did it. The problem seems to be in our own perception of how God is at work. Isaiah 43:19 put it this way; "I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert."

Languishing in Babylon meant it was hard for the Israelites to see how God was answering their prayers, but after 70 years, Cyrus of Persia overtook Babylon and freed the Israelites to return to their homeland. Their prayers were answered! So continue to believe in the power of prayer, just as we remind ourselves in our vision statement. God is at work, so your prayers are important! See you in church.

The Practice of Prayer Women's Bible Study, Sat., August 11th at 10 a.m.

We are studying prayer this summer in our women's Bible study. In the June study we learned about the importance of persistence in prayer. The apostle Peter once asked Jesus how many times he should forgive someone – even seven times. Jesus told him "seventy-seven times". It's not about numbers. Rather it's more about the practice of forgiveness and what we are becoming. Prayer is like that. In prayer we are becoming what God intended us to be – a people in touch, first of all, with the Almighty and then with each other. When Pastor Don was seriously ill we all prayed constantly; we later learned that one little girl had prayed every night that he would be ok. We want to be known as people who pray at Pilgrim. There are so many kinds of prayers and so many opportunities to pray. Our meditation room is always open. We can go in and just sit quietly if we want, or we can take advantage of the materials laid out on the table to guide us in our study and prayers. There are many types of prayers; we studied prayer stones, prayer bracelets and labyrinths in our July Bible study. We will learn about the four dimensions of prayer in August. Women of the church are invited to gather Saturday, August 11th at 10 am at the church to study the four dimensions of prayer which are: Speaking to God, Listening to God, Contemplating or seeking God's presence, and Community.
