Christmas Eve Readings Isaiah 9:2-7 Psalm 96 Titus 2:11-14 Luke 2:1-14 (15-20)

From your Pastor:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

If you come to church on Christmas Day you will hear a reading from the first chapter of John. As a matter of fact, this is usually the ONLY time we read this passage in church, with the rare exception of when there are two Sundays in the season of Christmas. That doesn't happen this year, so we will only read John 1:1-14 on Christmas Day, and then we'll put it away again for another 365 days.

One of the reasons I enjoy serving you on Christmas Day is because I love this particular passage. I like it much better than the familiar passage in Luke where we hear about angels and shepherds. I like it more than the passage in Matthew where we read about the magi from the east. It is, without a doubt, my favorite Christmas passage because it is the only one where the Bible specifically tells us, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word *was* God." (Italics mine)

John begins his whole book with an explanation that Jesus is God in human flesh, but the part I like the best is where John says, "And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth." Jesus came to live where we live. Jesus came, as a line from the Christmas cantata observes, "and moved into the neighborhood." Jesus lives right here in Othello, and Jesus lives wherever there are people of faith. "The Word became flesh and lived among us."

Many people believe that when Jesus ascended into heaven that was the end of his earthly presence, but I don't think that is correct because near the end of the book of John, Jesus gives his disciples the gift of the Holy Spirit. It went like this; "Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit'." (John 20:21, 22)

We believe in God of the Trinity. We believe in the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. If that is true, then there has never been a time since Christ walked the face of the earth that God was apart from us. God gives us God's own Holy Spirit to all people of faith to be in and among us, guiding us and leading us, not just at Christmas, but always. God loves you! Why would God leave? God is with you right now, even as you read this!

It isn't hard to see the presence of the Holy Spirit in our midst. All we have to do is look for those little God moments around us. God was with us when I suffered a pulmonary embolism and went into the hospital for weeks. God was with us again when I needed heart surgery. God was with Jack McFarlin at home and God was on the golf course with Larry McCourtie to welcome them into the heavenly realm, and God is with Larry's and Jack's families to assure them that the promise of eternal life is true. God is with those who suffer, offering peace and comfort in the hands of caregivers. God is in the voices of our children as they sing Christmas songs and tell us again the Christmas story. God is in the light that is shared from person to person on Christmas Eve as we sing 'Silent Night'. God is with us at all times and in all places because the Word became flesh and moved into the neighborhood. God is with us, which in Hebrew is 'Emmanuel'. "O Come, O Come Emmanuel." May you feel the presence of God in your Christmas celebration and always. See you in church.
