Synod Assembly Recap Global Mission: We Walk Together, May 17 – 19, 2019 By Fay Coats

Global mission was our theme and main focus throughout the weekend as we met together with the Eastern WA/Idaho Synod Assembly. Accompaniment became our buzz word as we studied mission rooted in relationship which means mutuality, inclusivity, vulnerability, sustainability and empowerment. Pastor Moses Nwaka (who worshipped with us at Pilgrim May 12th) and Pastor Eliud Payowela from our sister congregation in Tanzania were there the entire weekend. We have walked with our sister synod for 25 years. Some of us remember Bishop Bob Keller who served as pastor at Pilgrim Lutheran in the early 1960s. He was the one who established the relationship between the Ulanga Kilombero Diocese and the EaWAID Synod. Throughout the Assembly, the importance of telling the stories of what our church – the ELCA- is doing worldwide was stressed. Our Living Lutheran Magazine has a mission story each month; it is on page 38 in the May issue of the magazine and tells how ELCA World Hunger sends funds to the Milagro center in Guatemala City, which is run by the Augustinian Lutheran Church of Guatemala.

Bishop Kristen Kuempel addressed the Assembly at the opening worship service on Friday reminding us that we walk together or we don't walk at all – that we are all a part of the family of God with our great diversity. Lots is happening in our Synod. Bishop Kuempel has made significant staff changes at the synod level – some as cost cutting measures and some to support congregations and people of the synod. Mary Morrow has been called to serve as director of Evangelical Mission for our Synod. She is officially employed by the ELCA Church wide office and they pay her salary. Pastor Phil Misner has been hired as assistant to the Bishop taking on many responsibilities. He is assisting congregations throughout the synod in the call process and working with Bishop Kuempel to help congregations in conflict or transitions.

More emphasis has been placed on the churches meeting together in clusters to remain connected. There's also a new website and improved social media. The bishop asked us to go back to our congregations with the following message: "Thank you, a big thank you! Your mission support to the synod is the highest it has been in ten years. We use your dollars to support the National ELCA and local ministries like Lutherhaven, Campus Ministries, Luther Heights, and various congregational needs

During the business session a resolution was passed to receive New Day Lutheran Church from Idaho Falls as a congregation of the EWAID synod. Also approved was a resolution to change the name of the synod to Northwest Intermountain Synod, to better reflect all the people and congregations who call it home.

You may recall that our Synod voted at last year's Assembly to meet in full Assembly this year which we just did. Then, in 2020, we will have regional meetings, the closest of which to us will be May 16th in Moses Lake for a one day gathering. We will meet again in full Assembly in 2021 at the Red Lion Inn in Pasco, WA. This type of schedule will then be evaluated and a decision will be made whether to adopt this schedule permanently.

Our Synod offering this year was divided between Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service and the Ulanga Kilombero Diocese in Tanzania.
