At our annual congregational meeting on Sunday, January 26th, we took the following action:

- 1) We discussed & adopted the 2020 Mission Budget of \$132,657.
- 2) We elected Tammy & Pete Rodriguez to second terms on council and elected Don Wade to his first term.
- 3) We adopted a new constitution that aligns with the new name of our synod, the Northwest Intermountain Synod of the ELCA.
- 4) We reviewed written & oral summaries of our committees and their activities in 2019.
- 5) We reviewed & approved the minutes of the Congregational meeting held January 2019.

Following our meeting, we gathered in the Fellowship Hall for a great potluck and fellowship with each other. **Thank you to everyone for bringing such wonderful food to share!**

Mission Interpreter's Report

We are a church that rolls up our sleeves and gets to work.

Over 240 ELCA missionaries serve in more than 40 countries around the world, invited by global church partners to work together hand-in-hand. Some are doctors in rural areas. Others teach children where there are few opportunities to go to school, or work in seminaries that prepare pastors and future church leaders. Others support, nurture and preach in some of the fastest growing Lutheran congregations in the world. And still others are young adults, engaging in a life-changing, year-long experience through the Young Adults in Global Mission.

The ELCA Young Adults in Global Mission program invites ELCA young adults ages 21-29 into a transformative, year-long journey in international service. As they offer themselves in service, ELCA young adults are shaped by the witness of our global neighbors. They share in the journeys of companion churches and organizations in one of nine countries around the world.

A year of service through the Young Adults in Global Mission program invites young adults to become the hands and feet of Jesus in the world, providing critical support to ministries and projects in communities of need. It also invites volunteers into a journey of self-reflection, providing space to consider their sense of identity, God's work in the world, and their place within it all.

As the ELCA, we support this mission. I will bring more stories of these young people who serve in many different countries and in many different capacities. —Anna

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

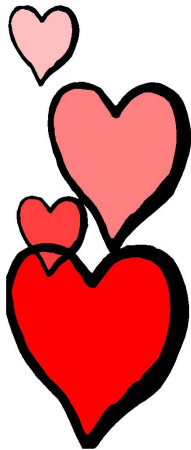
