

June 2021 Message from our Pastor

Dear Pilgrims,

I was reading an article the other day that estimated there will be 51 MILLION RVs on the roads of America this summer! By anyone's estimate, that is a huge number of campers. Campsites will be crowded, resorts will be busy, and the smell of campfires will permeate the air, perhaps overtaking the smell of the pine trees in the forests.

Anna and I will be among the 51 million. We will be camping for a couple of days at the beginning of this month, then again in the middle, and we have a nice, long vacation planned for July where we will be gone for almost two weeks. We even have a short getaway planned for August. We plan to put a few miles on that motorhome of ours this summer. It doesn't do any good sitting in the driveway.

It is enjoyable to get away from the stress of everyday life for a little while and do something relaxing like camping. It is an important part of taking care of yourself. Too often in this country we read of how many people never take a vacation and how many people work too much. According to 20-something finance, "In the U.S., 85.8 percent of males and 66.5 percent of females work more than 40 hours per week." That is not helpful for anyone, because "for many of us, more work leads to more stress and a lower quality of life, and stress is the #1 cause of health problems – mentally and physically." We Americans are getting pretty lousy at remembering the commandment God gave us to, "Remember the Sabbath Day, and keep it holy. Six days you shall labor

and do all your work. But the seventh day is a sabbath to the Lord your God; you shall not do any work." (Exodus 20:8-10a) According to the U.S. Travel Association, 55% of Americans do not use their paid vacation days, and in 2019, a record 768 MILLION paid vacation days went unused.

People seem to be reluctant to take time off because they are afraid they will miss something important at work, but it turns out that the opposite seems to be true. "A growing body of research shows taking time off actually increases productivity by making workers more resilient, improving cognitive function, creativity and problem-solving." according to Bryan Robinson, Psychotherapist.

Even Jesus knew it was good to take some time off now and again. After his disciples returned from the mission where he sent them out, two by two, to heal and teach in Jesus' name, they "gathered around Jesus and told him all they had done and taught. He said to them, 'Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while.'" (Mark 6:30-31)

So, this summer, take some time to enjoy yourself. Get some sabbath rest. Relax and do something that makes you smile, and the world will be a better place. You will return rested and refreshed, and ready to take on God's mission once again. I'll see you in church (when you get back from vacation).


