

September Message from our Pastor Dear Pilgrims,

Here we go again. I don't know about you, but I am exasperated by the return of the mask mandate issued August 18th by the governor's office. I was enjoying going around without a mask. I was enjoying the few benefits that come with being vaccinated, but now, because there is a new variant called Delta, we are all at risk again, so our best course of action is to mask up for the sake of each other in worship. I think many of us are disappointed. I would even guess that many of us are frustrated. It is even possible that some of us are dismayed. I totally get it. I do not like wearing a mask either, but I think it is certainly my responsibility to ensure the safety of those who gather for worship, plus, as Paul reminded us in Romans 13, "Let every person be subject to the governing authorities; for there is no authority except from God, and those authorities that exist have been instituted by God." (Romans 13:1) I do not like the mask mandate, but I will follow it for your sake. By the way, Paul wrote that while the Romans were the rulers of Israel. Paul did not like Roman rule either, but he was willing to comply with the government and taught his people to do the same. People seemed to live much longer if they obeyed the Roman laws.

I think wearing a mask again is a reasonable thing to do to combat COVID-19. It is not difficult, even though it is frustrating. Together, we will get through this pandemic eventually. Medicines will get better. More people will be vaccinated. Case counts will go down, but until then, as Joshua told the Israelites after the death of Moses, "Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the LORD your God is with you wherever you go." Keep the faith, dear Pilgrims, and I will see your lovely, masked face in church.
