From your Pastor:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On Palm Sunday we will read together again the story of the Passion of Christ. We will hear again how Jesus came into Jerusalem with loud shouts of "Hosanna to the Son of David" on Sunday, only to be betrayed by Thursday and crucified on Friday. Wow! How quickly things can change!

This year we will read from the Gospel According to Matthew, which is the only one of the four gospels that mentions that there were Temple guards stationed at the tomb to prevent grave robbing, and the only gospel that mentions there was an earthquake at the time of the resurrection. The other gospel writers didn't seem to think those details were important enough to include in their writings, so that makes me wonder what, among those details, caught Matthew's imagination? Why did he, and he alone, decide to include the meeting between the chief priests and Pilate where the priests confided in the governor that they were afraid the disciples were going to raid the tomb? Why did Matthew decide to include the part about the earthquake? And only Matthew says the angel sat on the stone. In the other gospels the angel either sits inside the tomb or stands beside the women who had brought burial spices. What is Matthew emphasizing by including these details?

It may seem like minor, trivial details to some people, but I think Matthew is up to something. I think Matthew is emphasizing God's power over the powers of this world. I think Matthew is letting us know that, while we may have the power the threat of death, with guards and weapons and fear, God has the ultimate power of life *over* death! The resurrection is God's exclamation point in the defeat of sin and death. The resurrection is where God displays to us and for us that God is not interested in death. The resurrection shows that God does not want to be separated from us by sin. God is ultimately and finally most interested in creating an unending bond of love and offering us eternal life. No power on earth can stand up against that.

We may try to contain God in tombs. We may try to guard against God's actions. We may try to defeat God's power with weapons, but none of that works. God's love, I am convinced, is *the most powerful force in the universe!* We cannot run from God's love because God knows where we are. Read Psalm 139 and you will know what I mean. We cannot get God to stop loving us no matter what we do because God forgives us. Psalm 103 says, "He forgives all your iniquity and heals all your diseases." (Ps. 103:3) Finally, even death is no barrier for God. The resurrection proves that. It was enough evidence for Paul to write, "I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things in the present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 8:38-39) We worship God, the most powerful force in the universe, and we participate with God by being disciples of the most powerful King in the universe, and that gives us something to celebrate! Happy Easter! See you in church.


