Synod Assembly Update and Thank You

Synod Assembly was held May 19-21 in Spokane. As your delegates, Anna Short and Kristi Spohr thank you for the privilege of representing our congregation at the Assembly. We appreciate the prayers you offered on our behalf.

Pastor Kristen Kuempel was elected to the position of Bishop on the 4th ballot. The budget was passed and Bishop Wells was gently roasted and presented with several gifts after his tenure of 18 years as Bishop of the EaWA-Idaho Synod. The Synod also showed appreciation to Pastor Helga Jansons who will be leaving work at the synod level to accept a call to pastor at an individual church.

From your Pastor:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

There was a lot of excitement around the election of our new bishop at synod assembly. As the six candidates spoke I was glad to hear each of them talk about how the Holy Spirit is at work not only in the church, but in the lives of those who were candidates for bishop. Each of them spoke about prayer and devotion. Each of them spoke about seeking the guidance of the Holy Spirit as they undertake the task of church leadership, so when Pastor Kristen Kuempel from First Lutheran in Kennewick was finally elected on the fourth ballot we knew it was the work of the Holy Spirit. We had prayed for God to guide each ballot. We had prayed for God to be present on those who were candidates, and we had prayed with thanksgiving for those who were not selected and for the long tenure of Bishop Wells.

It was kind of like when Samuel anointed David as king of Israel to succeed Saul. Do you remember that story? Jesse had eight sons. Seven of them were passed over by God. Nobody expected David to be anointed because he was the youngest. He had no worldly experience. He was just a kid, but that was exactly who God wanted. You can read the whole story in 1 Samuel 16. Pastor Kuempel has no bishop experience but she is exactly who God wanted so we will give her our full support. It was a privilege to see God at work in our synod. Thank you for keeping your representatives and me in prayer at assembly.

Now that June is here we have some other exciting things coming up at Pilgrim, some of which may be labeled. "The second annual..." For instance, on June 3rd we will celebrate the second annual Pentecost Vigil with s'mores. Hopefully this year the weather will be good enough to hold it in the vacant lot behind the church where we can have a wood Pentecost fire. Last year we were grateful for Jim's propane fireplace, but a real wood fire would bring more authenticity to our celebration. We will see what God has in mind for us.

The second annual 'Worship Without Walls' is also coming in June. Get your hats ready for some outdoor worship on June 25th. I plan to decorate my hat with a little bit more color than I did last year and I am already collecting things with which to adorn my sombrero.

In between those two events will be some other great opportunities such as celebrating the accomplishments of our graduates on June 4th, which is also Pentecost Sunday so please wear red to worship, not only to recognize the presence of the Holy Spirit, but the Othello Huskies color is red and the Washington State University color is also red (some call it crimson but I can't tell the difference) so we can celebrate with Emilee and Kelsey all they have done. We will also celebrate some baptisms and Anna and I will take some vacation time in June. There's a lot going on, but God will be with us in all of it, just like God was with us at synod assembly.
