# "Katie Luther, First Lady of the Reformation"

When: October 15, 2017

What time: 2 pm

Where: Reichert Showhouse

Katherine (Katie) Von Bora, the wife of the great reformer Martin Luther, will share the story of how a lowly monk challenged the mightiest power on earth in his day with the posting of 95 theses for debate. Dr. Luther's Scriptural insights and his almost single-handedly placing the Bible in the hands of the common people for the first time in their everyday language, resulted in the transformation of the Christian Church which continues to this day.

Katie Luther will be portrayed by Reverend Gwen Ehrenborg from Camano Island. She is a retired Methodist pastor and is a recognized authority on both Katie and Martin Luther and the Reformation Era.

Plan to attend this event as part of our Commemoration of this year's 500th Anniversary of the Protestant Reformation. Look for more information as October gets closer.

#### Calling All Quilters!

This year the quilters return on August 30. Just as the children are I back in school, the quilters are back cutting and ironing squares, matching materials, tying, and sewing up these wonderful quilts. They strive to make their quota of 300 guilts working on Wednesdays only until the end of May. It takes a lot of energy, creativity, and commitment to reach this goal. It is definitely a labor of love! On Sunday, July 30, we had a NOISY offering to help with quilting expenses. Batting for inside the quilts and shipping are the two main expenses. It costs just over \$100 per roll of batting and they are able to get 24 guilts from one roll. That means \$1200-\$1500 just for the batting. In addition, shipping runs about \$800 depending on the weight of the quilts. Our Church Council has allocated \$1000 from our budget for the past 2 years to help defray the guilting costs. #### From your Pastor:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

By the end of this month our children will be back in school. We will entrust them to the schools to learn what they need to know to become good and productive members of society. Education is good and very important work because educated, church attending people are more successful and happier, according to many research studies. The Bible seems to agree. Proverbs 9:9 says "Give instruction to a wise man, and he will be still wiser; teach a righteous man, and he will increase in learning." In Proverbs 16:16 it says, "How much better to get wisdom than gold! To get understanding is to be chosen rather than silver." And in 16:20, "Those who are attentive to a matter will prosper, and happy are those who trust in the Lord." Church tradition holds that the book of Proverbs was written by King Solomon, the son of King David, and it was widely believed he was the wisest ruler in the history of Israel, so he knows what he's talking about!

Even Martin Luther emphasized the importance of education. Since this is the 500th anniversary year of the Reformation, it seems fitting to remember the contributions Luther made to our modern society. To the German nobility, Martin Luther wrote, "Oh! how unwisely we deal with our poor young folk, whom we are commanded to train and instruct [Prov. 22:6]! But we shall have to give a serious account of our stewardship, and explain why we have not set the Word of God before them."

During the months of August and September we will be collecting school supplies to help children get a good education. As you are going about your regular shopping be sure to swing through the aisle of school supplies and pick up a few things. If you have any questions about what is needed you may contact Sharon Bray or Sandi Bosch. They are coordinating the collection for school kits.

Since we are talking about going back to school, it makes me feel like this is a good time to talk about fall activities coming up. Our last summer activity is our all church picnic at Barb and Larry Maine's house on August 27th, then on September 10th we will host another 'Blessing of the First Responders'. Weather permitting; we will hold our worship service outdoors in the parking lot. Also in September is our All Church Retreat at Camp Lutherhaven in Idaho. Flyers are available at the church or you may contact Bob Reichert for more information. In October we will be gearing up for our observance of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation with a visit from Katie Luther on October 15th at 2 pm at the Reichert Showhouse. We culminate our anniversary observance with our Festival Worship and Reformation Oktoberfest on October 29th here at Pilgrim. This fall will be a wonderful time of fellowship and fun and I am looking forward to sharing it with you! See you in church.
