From your Pastor:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I wonder if you have seen the commercial for some appliances that talks about how your appliances should be ready for the holidays. Family and friends come to the door and appliances get used as a significant part of holiday hospitality. It sounds a bit silly, but that is a unique way to get you thinking about your appliances. Without saying so many words, the commercials are asking you if you are ready to greet the holidays. Are you in good shape in all of your preparations? Are there enough rooms, food, tableware, linens, towels, and other things to make your family comfortable when everyone gathers to celebrate?

Commercials are designed to create a mindset of scarcity so that we feel the need to purchase whatever is being sold. We are taught that what we have is not enough, insufficient, inadequate, unsatisfactory. But the last time I went to a gathering of my family the appliances were of little concern. We all shared food and didn't seem to mind being gathered in a place that felt crowded with all of us. We were there to share the love that God has first given us, and that seemed like a very satisfying gathering all by itself.

It is November, when our thoughts turn to giving thanks. We will begin this month by giving thanks to God for the gifts of those who have left their faithful lives among us to join in the eternal feast of victory. We will end the month by giving thanks to God for Jesus Christ who is our King. In between, of course, is a day specifically called Thanksgiving! Both the first Sunday of the month, All Saints Sunday, and the last, Christ the King Sunday, are occasions when wearing white to worship is appropriate because white is the color of purity and we will celebrate our purity bought with the blood of Christ as it says in Revelation 7:14, "These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb."

Christ the King Sunday is also celebrated with white because of a passage in Revelation. The angels say to Jesus, "You are worthy to take the scroll and to open its seals, for you were slaughtered and by your blood you ransomed for God saints from every tribe and language and people and nation; you have made them to be a kingdom and priests serving our God, and they will reign on earth." (Rev. 5:9,10)

This November, as you gather with family and friends and celebrate a time to give thanks, remember all that God has given you in the gift of our Savior, Jesus Christ. Even if your appliances are not up to the task, remember the words of Paul, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18) Have a fabulous November and I'll see you in church.
