Women's Bible Study



Why do we do a Blessing of the Animals in October?

The annual Blessing of the Animals service is coming up on **October 6th** this year. Each year we bless our pets and service animals on the Sunday closest to the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, which is October 4th.

St. Francis is the patron saint of all animals, and legend has it he used to preach to the birds while they sat on his arms and shoulders and listened. In the Scriptures, the act of blessing means 'the imparting of power or life.' The person performing the blessing is mediating that power from God or Christ to the animal involved. To bless is more than an expression of goodwill and caring. To bless is to impart God's power in person! The blessing of each animal, by name, means that health, healing and life are being mediated from God for the benefit of the animal in its relationship with its human partners. We will bless all animals immediately following our regular worship service on October 6th. Animals are welcome to attend worship with their human companions. See you then!

October message from our Pastor:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Whenever fall comes around, I look forward to one main thing. Is it football? No. Is it the baseball playoffs? No. Is it the colorful fall leaves? No. Those are all great fall things for some people, but for me, every fall means fresh apples. Right now, the produce stands are full of the new crop of apples. I love fresh apples! I love the crisp, juicy texture when I bite into one and I love the sweet, tangy taste of a perfectly ripe apple. I don't bother baking it into a pie or mashing it into sauce. Don't even THINK of covering it with a candy coating or caramel! I'll just wash a nice, fresh Gala apple and eat it raw, skin and all, right down to the core.

Some people think that the apple was the forbidden fruit that Eve and Adam ate in the Garden of Eden. There's nothing about that in Scripture. The Bible only says that, "Of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat." (Genesis 2:17a, RSV) But if you read Eve's description of it; "The woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes" it sounds like it could easily have been an apple. They are indeed attractive and delightful to look at, and they certainly are good for food, but lots of other fruits qualify in that department as well.

Scripture DOES imply that the apple is precious, however. Psalm 17 says, "Guard me as the apple of the eye; hide me in the shadow of your wings." The psalm implies that the apple of the eye is precious enough to be guarded, and we, who are children of God, are the apples of God's eye!

But as delightful as apples are, I think there is a fruit that is even more precious. This fruit has never been forbidden, and that is the fruit of the Spirit. In Paul's letter to the Galatians he explains, "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. There is no law against such things. If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit. (Galatians 5:22, 23 and 25). So, a life guided by the Holy Spirit will be a fruitful life. Life guided by the Holy Spirit can be a joyful experience. And the best news is that the fruit of the Holy Spirit can be harvested anytime, not just late summer or fall. You don't even need a ladder! God is available to us to guide our lives into fruitful service whenever we make ourselves available for God.

How will we know if our lives are guided by the Holy Spirit? As Martin Luther wrote in the Small Catechism, we, the church, are called, gathered, enlightened and made holy by the Holy Spirit, and kept with Jesus Christ in the one common, true faith. So, as Christians, we can't help but be guided by the Holy Spirit, so we will show forth the fruit of the Holy Spirit in our daily lives. I look forward to sharing in this fruit with you as we are guided by the Holy Spirit in all that we do together. See you in church.
