- 1) regular bars of soap (no minis or hotel size) in original packaging
- 2) Adult size toothbrushes in original packaging
- 3) Regular sturdy comb w/o packaging (no picks or fine toothed combs)
- 4) Metal nail clippers w/o packaging
- 5) Lightweight bath-size towels, dark colors preferred, measuring up to 52"x27"
- 6) Rubber bands, string, ribbon, or yarn to secure each kit

Advent Fair Coming December 8

Our Advent Fair this year is hosted by Fay Coats and Anna Short on Dec. 8 following the worship service. This year's proceeds will go to the Coyote Ridge Corrections Center. Coyote Ridge runs a prison-based program where inmates are paired with dogs that need training. Most of the dogs come from Adams County Pet Rescue. The idea is to have the inmates work with the dogs to make them more adoptable. The program is in need of \$1000 to continue. It has received money from the state in the past but has not received any state funds since 2018. In addition to the \$1000 to run the program each year, it also depends on the shelter to provide basic needs for the dogs such as food. Without that \$1000, all involved in this program are concerned about it's future. Currently, several of the inmates crochet and/or knit stuffed dogs and cats as well as hats to sell. They do this throughout the year and sell the items at adoption events all year long. This program helps the inmates because it so positively affects the dogs, and the care they give to the dogs is reciprocated when the inmates see how positively the dogs are impacted.

We will also be having a **potluck** on Dec. 8 while the Fair is going on. Please bring a dish to share, with an emphasis on side dishes & desserts. Ham will be provided! Any questions on what to bring, please talk to Fay or Anna.



December message from our Pastor:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I don't make a regular practice of using this space to discuss things that are not strictly related to Pilgrim Lutheran, or even the Lutheran Church in general, but this month I would like to take a moment to urge you to take an opportunity to see the Othello Choral Society's Christmas Cantata. It is a new cantata by Mary McDonald and Jay Rouse called "Love Made a Way" and it is almost a variety show in the diversity of musical styles among all the songs. From familiar Christmas carols to Gospel style showstoppers, this is a cantata to remember.

I am privileged to sing the part of Joseph in the duet called, "This Son". Many of us think we know about Joseph and Mary from what the Bible says. We know that Mary was an obedient servant of the Lord, and we know that Joseph was a righteous man who was also compassionate enough that he didn't want to see Mary face public disgrace. We know that Joseph heard from angels through his dreams and, perhaps skeptically, decided to marry Mary anyway, even though she was pregnant, and he knew the child was not his.

In the duet in the cantata though, we get a glimpse into what could likely have been different viewpoints for Mary and Joseph. The song begins with Joseph assuring Mary that he is with her and she is not alone in delivering her baby, and then he admits that neither of them had counted on lodging in a barn when they got to Bethlehem. Joseph seems tender, but almost sheepish when he sings, "But God will see us through." Then Mary begins to sing. I really like how the composers finally give us a glimpse into Mary's concern over what God is doing through her. She sings, "Should the Son of God be born here in this lowly place?" Almost as if she is finally having second thoughts about her role as mother to the Son of God. It seems obvious that she hadn't counted on giving birth in a barn!

If you recall, Mary sang in the first chapter of Luke, "[God] has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant... He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly; he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty." (Luke 1:48a, 52, 53) So I wonder if Mary had higher expectations of the accommodations where she would bear the Son of God. It seems like when she got to Bethlehem, the lowly were NOT lifted up. The rich were NOT sent away empty, and in the duet from the cantata Mary seems disappointed. To me, it is the most realistic and accurate portrayal of what Mary may have been thinking when she went into labor on that first Christmas night. I hope you get a chance to come and hear it for yourself.

This is a busy month full of Christmas events, extra services at church, family get-togethers and so much extra shopping. But in the midst of the rush, as the Christmas carol reminds us, "Oh, rest beside the weary road and hear the angels sing!" (It Came Upon the Midnight Clear, ELW #282). See you in church—and at the cantata!

Let's Talk About Taxes-Message from Kristi!

This is a topic that I have wanted to talk about for quite a while, but I lack the technical knowledge and terminology to do so myself. Thank you to **Randy Deasy** for contributing the following information!

Here is a tax idea as the end of 2019 approaches: Recent changes in the tax law, including increasing the standard deduction (\$24,400 for married joint filers) have made it harder to take advantage of itemizing deductions. If you are at least 70 ½ years young, and are receiving required minimum distributions (RMD) from an IRA (not a 401K), this may interest you. You can designate a portion of your RMD to go directly to a 501(c)(3) organization (Pilgrim Lutheran Church, for example). The annual limit is up to \$100,000 per person of what would otherwise be taxable income and must be deducted from the IRA by the RMD deadline, typically Dec. 31. These qualified charitable donations (QCDs) provide an even greater tax benefit because they will never be included in your adjusted gross income. Also, the QCDs go toward satisfying your required minimum distribution. Other strategies, such as using donor-advised funds, stacking / lumping of donations or gifting of highly appreciated stock, can be discussed with your tax professional or financial adviser, keeping in mind the cutoff date for action – Dec 31, 2019.
