As part of being your Mission Interpreter for the synod and our church, I thought t would be a good time to introduce you to Lutheran World Relief and part of what they do. It seems a good time to talk about the school kits that the quilters send out every year.

Lutheran World Relief has been partnering with Children's Gift Ministry (CGM) since 2015 to distribute school kits to 14,000 children annually in some of the most vulnerable communities throughout Honduras. In coordination with the Assembly of God church network, CGM mobilizes a network of more than 3,000 volunteers throughout the country to accomplish this important work, reaching areas that would otherwise be inaccessible.

CGM Country Director Pastor Jose Portillo says these seemingly simple gifts have a transformative difference on the lives of children and families in these communities.

"For families living in extreme poverty, they put all their energy into putting food on the table. School materials are mandatory for students to enroll and for poor families, it is a cost many of them just can't handle," says Pastor Portillo.

Ken Harrell, founder and executive director of CGM, says he is thankful for the meaningful partnership between Lutheran World Relief and CGM.

"Providing children with an opportunity to get an education is our high calling and changing the nation through education is our challenge. We are so very grateful for the partnerships that make this possible," he says.

After watching her children receive their school kits, happily ruffling through their notebooks and the rest of the contents of their backpacks, Rosa was filled with joy.

"I feel very blessed for what we have received because I wasn't expecting this at all. God really shows himself in interesting ways," she says.

Update on Super Bowl of Caring:

9.7 Million in dollars and food items has been collected through Souper Bowl of Caring this year alone. Washington State contributed \$24,648.54, and Pilgrim Lutheran was part of it all!

Cell Tower Update for September

More progress has been made on the goal of finally allowing AT&T Wireless to rent space from us for a cell tower in our vacant lot. A hearing was held on July 29th to discuss any community concerns about the tower. Some concern was expressed about the fact that it was being listed as a 'bell tower' and there were concerns about noise levels. As a condition of the permit and to be good neighbors we have agreed that the tower will be silent. There will be bells for show only. They will not ring. After the hearing examiner decided that the cell tower was within the scope of the conditional use permit and ruled that the findings of fact and rule of law would permit its construction, the permit was issued on August 5th. Residents may appeal the decision until August 26th.

In the meantime, Ernie Summers has been working diligently with the consultants in Sequim to finalize the conditions of the lease agreement. Once the final details are in place and the city issues a building permit the construction may begin. Continue to check upcoming newsletters or talk to Ernie, any council member, or Pastor Don if you have any questions.
