April 2021 Message from our Pastor

Dear Pilgrims,

Have you ever noticed that God reminds us of the resurrection every year? As we celebrate Easter on April 4th, God is bringing new life to the world around us. The trees are budding, there are fresh daffodils all around town, the forsythia is in full bloom, and leaves are beginning to appear on the trees. God is resurrecting the earth after the winter dormancy. Just as Jesus was dead for three days and then rose again, so the earth has appeared lifeless for three months during the cold, harsh winter, and now the earth is beginning to be reborn.

Solomon was aware of God's tendency to bring about resurrection. He wrote, "For now the winter is past, the rain is over and gone. The flowers appear on the earth; the time of singing has come." (Song of Solomon 2:11-12a)

Most of the month of April will be spent basking in the Easter season, the longest and most important season of the church year. It is a time spent focusing on new life, renewal, and revived energy as we see how God has been at work forming the church. God moved the disciples from the grief of the loss of Jesus to the joy of the resurrection, and then continued moving the disciples to sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ throughout the rest of the world. Because of the dedication of the disciples, the church was formed at Pentecost and quickly spread as far away as Rome, Greece and Asia and even on to Spain in just a few short years.

As we focus on the resurrection of Jesus at Easter and the resurrection of the earth as spring takes over from winter, maybe this would be a good season to think about the resurrection of other things, such as church attendance. Now that we are in Phase 3 of the State of Washington reopening plan, we are able to accommodate up to 50 percent of the capacity of our building. That means it is safe for you to come back to church. On any given Sunday, we almost never exceed our 50 percent capacity. Our average worship attendance is normally around 45 to 50 people, and the capacity of our building is about 175, so there is plenty of room. For now, we are still requesting that you wear a mask, even though most of the congregation is vaccinated. We still don't know if going without a mask is a risk to those who have not been vaccinated, so please, as a courtesy to your fellow Pilgrims, please wear a mask.

Come and visit with your friends and neighbors. Come and share in the fellowship of the risen Christ. Come and find yourself wrapped in the love of God that is shared with your fellow Pilgrims. Come and see what God is doing among us. Come, and I'll see you in church.


