February Message from our Pastor

Dear Pilgrims,

When February comes around each year, what are your first thoughts? Do you think of Groundhog Day? I have been to Punxatawney, Pennsylvania and I have seen Gobbler's Knob where Phil, the groundhog, makes his prediction year after year. The event is more excitement than accuracy, though, since Phil's record for accuracy is around 60%. Most meteorologists these days have an accuracy rating of around 85%-90%, so the information Phil gives us is much less than what you could get from modern methods.

No, February is not best known for Groundhog Day. What about President's Day? We celebrate the great minds that have guided our nation over the centuries, from George Washington to Abraham Lincoln and beyond, but not everyone is in agreement about who the great presidents are, so perhaps that is not the best thought for February, either.

No, it seems to me that the thing we think about the most in February is St. Valentine's Day. One quick walk through almost any store will show you that the primary focus for this month is on Valentine's Day. Even though the day was set aside to commemorate a martyred saint, it has come to be associated with the

feelings of love between people. Many people send Valentine's cards, give Valentine's candy, or send Valentine's flowers to the people they love.

But believe it or not, love is never just between two people. In every loving relationship, God is there. God shows up because God IS love. Love comes from God and God calls us to be loving to one another, as we are reminded in 1John 4:7-8. The only way we can love someone else is because God has given us love to share. "We love because he first loved us." (1John 4:19)

So, listen carefully this month, whether in person or online, to the Scripture readings. You will hear much about how much God loves you, and you will hear much about our call to love one another. You will hear that God gives us enough love to share, even with our enemies. You will hear Jesus say, "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you." (Notice Jesus never says to tolerate abuse, but to pray for the abuser.) Share the love God has given you and the world will be better for it. I'll see you in church or online.


