## March Message from our Pastor

Dear Pilgrims,

It doesn't take much to see that our world is dealing with a lot of stress right now. One quick scan of the news and you will see stories of political turmoil, global unrest, the aftermath of the pandemic or some other natural disaster, worries over climate change, environmental degradation, and even the baseball labor dispute, football players upset over coaching changes or salaries or being traded to the wrong team or whatever. There are lots of sources of stress these days.

It seems to me that we could all use a place to find rest. We could all use a place of solace. We could all use a place where we are accepted and loved unconditionally. We could come as we are, have a conversation with friends, get caught up on pleasant topics like how so-and-so likes her new car, or how he enjoyed that trip with the family. We could all use a nice break from the stress, so I would like to suggest you come to the Wednesday Evening Soup and Bread Suppers.

You will be seated at a table, and more than likely a round table. You will have soup, and sometimes a couple of varieties to choose from, and you will have bread, also with perhaps a couple of varieties to choose from. There will be butter for your bread and both hot and cold beverages available. There will also be conversation. You have the option to choose to participate in the conversation, or even simply to listen and learn what is important to the people around you.

Hopefully, after you have had a nice meal and some pleasant conversation, you will be refreshed enough to participate in a brief Evening Prayer worship service. We will be using the Holden Evening Prayer as our liturgy, which lends itself well to contemplation and relaxation. We will hear messages from Lutheran World Hunger and find out what work they are excited about this Lenten season. We will also have more conversation that is centered on how Pilgrim Lutheran will be able to participate in what God is doing both locally and globally.

These midweek Lenten Services are important, not only to us as a church, but also to God as our leader. They help us to fulfill a couple of important Scriptures which reflect our Lutheran understanding of law and gospel. Paul lays down the law in the letter to the Galatians by saying, "Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ." (Galatians 6:2) But Jesus offers us his message of gospel in Matthew when he says, "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." (Matthew 11:28-30) Plus, if you come both Sundays and Wednesdays, you will have two opportunities to hang out with me, your pastor, just in case you find you miss me during the week. Heaven knows I like to be with you! See you in church or online.
