

#### July Message from our Pastor

Dear Pilgrims,

Has the high cost of fuel altered your travel plans for the summer? Anna and I have decided to make a few adjustments in our vacation destinations this summer also. Last year, we took a nice, long road trip across the state of Montana and into North Dakota. We spent time looking at Theodore Roosevelt National Park and spotting bison, deer, prairie dogs and wild horses, and we attended the Medora Musical. This year we are spending our vacation time camping again, but we will be staying closer to home.

Last year, among our spontaneous travels, we happened across the small town of Red Lodge, Montana. We were charmed by its small-town character and wowed by the beauty of the Beartooth Mountains that surround it. This year, all we can do is pray for the people of Red Lodge. The town has been devastated by the same floodwaters that closed Yellowstone National Park in Wyoming.

If you have been looking at the news, you have seen the damage that just a few days of flooding has done. People have lost homes, businesses have closed down, and some roads are completely washed out. Some places will not be accessible for a very long time. So, we wonder what we can do. How can we be helpful to our brothers and sisters in Montana and Wyoming? How can we work to bring peace to those who are recovering from the wildfires in New Mexico, or the tornado damage in Illinois, or the damage from high winds along the eastern seaboard?

First and foremost, this summer I would encourage you to pray. Oftentimes we feel like we pray, and it seems like nothing happens. We feel as though prayer is an ineffective tool against all the forces of nature, or even the forces of evil that seem to surround us daily. I can tell you that, even though it doesn't seem like we are making an impact, prayer works. I am living proof. You prayed for me when I was recovering from health problems and surgery, and now I am doing quite well.

So, let's give the same fervent prayers for the people of Montana and Wyoming. Let's pray for the people of Red Lodge, Yellowstone, and all other communities impacted by the flooding. While we're at it, we can pray for all the people impacted by natural disasters, and pray that we might find a solution to their causes. Pray, knowing that God is listening, and God is at work. As it says in 1John 5:14-15, "This is the boldness we have in him, that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have obtained the requests made of him."

Let's boldly ask God to be there for the people recovering from natural disasters. Let's pray and believe confidently that God is at work, answering our prayers. Let's pray, and keep on praying knowing that whatever we ask for, if it is God's will, it will be done. As Martin Luther was fond of saying, "Pray, and let God worry." If you need me, I will likely be camping, but I won't be too far away. We'll see you in church or online. Peace,
