December Message from our Pastor

Dear Pilgrims,

Welcome to December, the last month of the year. We are almost ready to close the curtains on 2022, and most of this month will be spent getting ready for, and then celebrating, Christmas. It seems we like to end the year on a joyful note, celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. But did you know that Christmas is actually one of the last celebrations to make it onto the church calendar? The first recorded celebration of Christmas on December 25th wasn't until the year 336, a full three hundred years after Jesus walked the face of the earth! Why did we wait so long, you may be wondering?

As it turns out, it is because Christians, at least in the early centuries of Christianity, didn't make a big deal out of when someone was born. Instead, it was much more important to the people of the church to make note of when someone died and entered the gates of heaven. The whole reason Christians have worship services on Sunday is because Jesus rose from the dead on a Sunday, giving us Easter, which was celebrated LONG before Christmas, and all of the saints' days, like Valentine's Day and St. Patrick's Day, are celebrated on the day those people died.

It wasn't until 336 that a pope determined that Christ was born on December 25th. The way he came up with that date was because the church had been celebrating the annunciation of Mary on March 25th for a few years already, and the pope simply did the math and wrote the date down.

But since the pope declared the date sacred, other people decided it was worth celebrating. The only problem was, they had no idea how to celebrate it, and they got no guidance from the church, because the church was trying not to make it a big deal. But of course, it was a big deal! So, people began to borrow the traditions of their pagan neighbors.

They noticed that the Romans gave the poor gifts on the feast of Saturnalia, on December 22nd, so they began doing that on Christmas, and even going one better than the Romans by giving gifts to their loved ones and children. About a thousand years later, in northern Europe, Christians noticed that their neighbors brought evergreen trees into their houses to celebrate the Solstice (December 21st or 22nd), decking them out with garland and candles, and another Christmas tradition was born.

In between those two things, a monk named Nicholas (before he was a saint, celebrated on December 6th) was moved to give away his family fortune. He would sneak into the homes of young ladies who lacked a dowry and would leave gold in their stockings as they hung by the fireplace to dry out after washing. (I'll bet you know where I'm going with that legend) Although, his outfit and reindeer were entirely the creation of an anonymous author in 1822 and by Clement C. Moore in his famous poem, published in 1823.

It was in the thirteenth century, after Christmas had been celebrated for almost a thousand years, that we finally hear the first Christmas carols, and hundreds have been written since. This year, you have the chance to participate in many of these sacred Christmas traditions, and our whole list of events is printed elsewhere in this newsletter. Come along and join in the celebration!
