#### **January Message from our Pastor**

Dear Pilgrims,

The New Year has arrived in its usual fashion. It seems to me that new years almost always start with the promise of hope. We hope that this year will be better than last year. We hope that friends and family will find health and happiness in this new year. We hope that wars will cease, and peace will return to places ravaged by the damage of battle. We hope for all kinds of things, like an end to hunger, poverty, and homelessness, and this year will bring its share of triumphs and tragedies, victories and defeats, highs, and lows.

So, what will make this year different from every other year, other than the numbers at the top of the calendar? It seems to me that the one variable that is in our control every year is us! We get to decide how we will approach each tragedy or triumph. We get to decide what our reaction will be to each defeat or victory. 


