#### **Congregational Meeting Recap**

Our annual congregational meeting was held Sunday, January 28th, directly after worship. Items on the agenda will include:

- Reviewed and Approved the minutes of the last Congregational meeting of Jan 29, 2023.
- Elected 3 council members Marcia Bougher and Larry Kirkpatrick (both beginning their 1st year of their 2nd term and Linda Bork who will be beginning her 1st year of her first term.
- Discussed and adopted the 2024 Mission Budget of \$155,280. Changes include a \$500 increase in Benevolences to the Synod, \$700 increase in utilities, \$400 increase in insurance, \$1680 increase in pastor's salary, and several areas where decreases were noted. See your annual report for more specific information regarding the budget.
- Marc explained how the Bell Fund (cell tower money) is being spent, and saved. Essentially 1/3 to charity, 1/3 to church budget, and 1/3 to capital project savings each year.
- Appointed Don Wade (outgoing council person, Ernie Summers (outgoing council president, and Marcia Bougher to the Nominating Committee for next year.
- Reviewed the operations and functions of the Endowment Committee, and the names of folk on the Committee. Paula McKay, Trudy Doolittle, Steve Jensen, Sandi Bosch, and Carolyn Bunch.
- Discussed the barricades placed at the church entrance on Elm Street. Pastor explained that they are there to prevent people racing their cars through the parking lot to avoid the stop sign on Elm. Their racing through the parking lot endangers the children who use our parking lot to walk through to Lutacaga, McFarland, and OHS. We voted to purchase stantions similar to the ones there which are borrowed from the city. They are easier to move than a gate would be. and much cheaper. They will only be up during school weeks, and down on weekends. vacations, and the summer.
- 8) Listened to highlights of the pastor's report.
- We concluded with the Lord's Prayer and adjourned to the Fellowship Hall.

The Annual Report is available in the Narthex for anyone who was not able to come to the congregational meeting. Members are encouraged to pick up a copy and peruse the activities and expenses of the church operation. We are an active bunch!

Following the meeting we shared a wonderful meal, with multiple salads, casseroles, ham, turkey, & desserts as only Pilgrim can put together. Many **Thanks** to everyone who helped in the kitchen and who brought food to share!
