March Message from our Pastor

Dear Pilgrims,

the famous saying for March is, 'in like a lion, out like a lamb' and both the lion and the lamb are symbols for Christ. Did you know that? Jesus is the Lion of Judah, and he's also the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. It is the Lion of Judah who gives us the strength to meet our daily challenges, and it is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world who meets us in our failures and leads us back to the fold of grace.
