The Northwest Intermountain Synod's Regional Gathering in Ellensburg was attended by Anna & Pastor Short, and Annie Smith from Pilgrim. People from all over Eastern Washington heard Grace Pomroy from Luther Seminary cover many aspects of stewardship, but one particular item stood out strongly. Grace showed us a graph that displayed current attendance trends in the ELCA. The graph showed that if current trends continue, weekly attendance across the whole country in ELCA churches would total just over 15,000 by the year 2041, way down from our current average of over 900,000. The best strategy to combat this trend is to pray for the church, but along with that we are encouraged to think about ways to use our facilities differently. Pray for Pilgrim Lutheran as we discover what God is doing with us, and our future. —-Pastor Don

Right off the bat, June is very exciting, but that's not all.
