Dear Pilgrims,

This is likely my last newsletter article to you. Anna and I will be retiring on July 27th and leaving for Portland right after church is finished. As I write this to you, I am filled with a whole range of emotions.

I am somewhat excited about retiring. Anna and I have long dreamed of the days when I would be retired, and we could sit next to each other in worship on Sunday morning. We have long held dreams of walking along a beach sometime during the school year when all the children are in school and we can walk the beach without dodging flocks of children. We have even talked about spending more time with our grandchild, Jonah, and maybe sharing Christmas Eve or Easter Sunday with family, without the responsibility of leading worship. I think it will be weird at first, not being in charge, but I think I'll get used to it, and maybe even enjoy it!

I am also somewhat melancholy about retiring. We have spent over 9 years among you, and we consider many of you good friends. I am hopeful that Anna and I will get to see Jonah grow into an ambitious young man, and I am hopeful that, along with carrying our relationships with all of you with us, we will form new relationships with people in our new community.

I am also hopeful that, as this congregation moves forward in the transition period between the day I retire and the day a new pastor is called, you will grow closer together as a Christian community, and you will also have time to connect with your ecumenical brothers and sisters in Othello to strengthen ties between this congregation and the others in town. I am hopeful that you will become even more aware of what it means to live out your mission statement that "Pilgrim Lutheran Church is led by the Holy Spirit to invite everyone to experience God's love and grace through life's pilgrimage of faith." 
